

## **Pastor's Note**

Dear Friends,

May is the month for racing. The Kentucky Derby is on Saturday May 4 and the Indy 500 is on Sunday May 26. These are both big races. The Kentucky Derby takes about 2 minutes to run whereas the 500 is a couple of hours. The winners of these races is the first to the finish line. It takes a lot of practice, patience, and perseverance to prepare for a race. Both Paul and the author of Hebrews use race metaphors to talk about faith. For both Paul and Hebrews, the main point is preparing ourselves to run the race and to persevere. To both winning the race is not necessarily coming in first, although Paul does state this in 1 Corinthians 9:24, but is in persevering to the end; overcoming peer pressure to abandon our faith, doubt, and injuries and illnesses to make it to the finish line and receive our prize. The prize or reward is eternal life with God. One of my favorite Olympic moments came in the 1992 Barcelona Olympics. Derrick Redmond of Great Britain was one of the favorites to win the 400 meters dash. In the semi-final race he tore his hamstring about halfway through the race and went down in agony. He struggled to get up and started painfully limping to the finish line. There was a disturbance in the stands and the cameras pan out to show a man climbing down from the stands and pushing away security to get to the runner. The man is John Redmond, Derrick's father. John proceeds to help Derrick to the finish line with the crowd cheering wildly and enthusiastically. This is the imagery we get from Hebrews. The saints cheering for us to make it to the finish

line. And we in turn, we do whatever is possible to cheer, encourage, and help others to the finish line, especially when they are down and out. That's the kind of church I want to be a part of. I'll see you in church every Sunday.
